

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP) - UTILITY BOX

PROPOSALS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON A CONTINUOUS BASIS UNTIL WORK IS COMPLETED.

Rick and Bonnie Fenaroli are pleased to **release a call to artists** to paint their **PG&E Utility Box located in Wild Wings Community, Woodland, CA**. We are seeking an artist to paint murals on **all sides of the** utility box. See attachment A for pictures and dimensions of the utility box. Artists may submit up to three designs. Artist will have 30 days to complete the work. You must live or work in Yolo or Solano County

In order to make an award, designs will be reviewed and approved by Rick and Bonnie Fenaroli, Wild Wings Architectural Review Committee and PG&E. This will be the first utility box painted in the development.

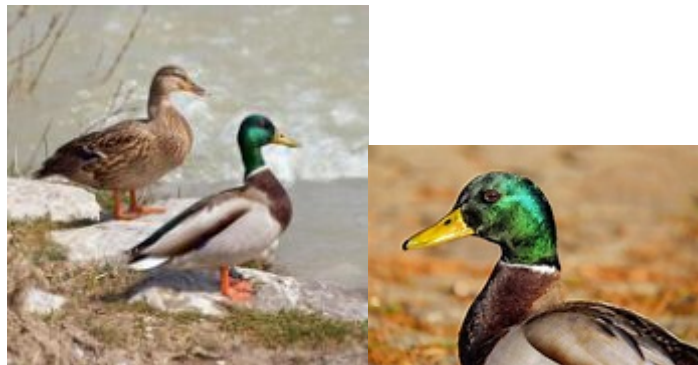
BUDGET

We will pay **\$600.00 stipend** for the painting of the utility box. The stipend includes all costs associated with design and installation of the artwork, including supplies, and any and all required insurance, taxes, etc. One-fourth of the stipend will be paid prior to beginning the work. The remaining stipend will be paid after the work is completed. Work shall begin within 30 days of the award and shall be completed no more than 30 days after work commences.

DESIGN PARAMETERS

The following are design parameters for the proposed Utility Box Mural Program:

- Design shall be consistent with Wild Wings community – wild life, golf, or aviation. All streets are named after duck breeds. We live on Mallard Street, if the artist chooses to provide a wild life design, we prefer the theme to represent Mallard ducks. Design shall be a quality work of art and appeal to a broad constituency.



- The artwork included on the application must closely resemble the art to be painted on the box.
- Boxes have locks, control panels, and meters that must remain free from any art image (see photos).
- When painting the box, it should be done in a manner that no moisture gets inside the box through any cracks or vents. Vents should also not be covered so as to not restrict airflow.
- Artwork containing a majority of dark colors will not be considered due to potential for overheating.
- Proposed artwork cannot contain copyrighted or trademarked images, brand names, or work copied from another source.
- Mural shall be all-weather and graffiti-resistant.

- Use only Acrylic Paint: Golden or Liquitex high-viscosity paint, lightfastness 1 is recommended. No vinyl wraps are permitted. Paint shall be all-weather and graffiti-resistant.
- See Attachment A for diagrams showing measurement of the utility box. PG&E requires that all stickers are to be left in their original state and not painted over. The same restriction applies to locks.

APPLICATION PROCESS

To apply, please submit one hard copy and one electronic copy of the complete proposals, which includes the following:

Artist's Proposal. Conceptual design drawings sufficient to communicate the artist's concept. Drawings shall be in color and shall be provided for all sides of the utility box.

Artist's Statement. Artist's statement which includes a description of the proposed artwork and how it relates to the one of the identified themes.

Color photos of relevant previous work (if applicable).

Artist's contact information.

Proposals will be accepted on a continuous basis until an award is made.
